## Sunday Night Youth

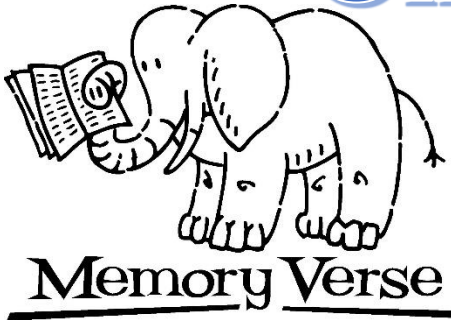

The delivery of shoe boxes is only the beginning of the Operation Christmas Child story. Gospel books in 80 local languages are offered to boys and girls. Before the boxes are handed to each child, they listen to the story of salvation through Jesus Christ. The Salvation story is placed on top of each box. The illustrated pages make the Good News of Jesus Christ come alive for children in a way they can understand. Since 2010, because of these shoe boxes, more than 7.4 million children worldwide have enrolled in the 12 week course following this initial meeting. 3.4 million have accepted Jesus as their Savior.
