

What Happened at General Conference 2019?

After three years of buildup and intense speculation, the special Called General Conference finally met and completed its work last Tuesday, February 26, in St. Louis, Missouri. So what happened?

After much debate, the 864 delegates voted on each of the three main plans brought before it. The Connectional Conference Plan, which would have divided the United Methodist Church into three smaller branches within the larger church, did not get enough votes to even get out of legislative subcommittee. So, it was never fully considered.

The One Church Plan, which would have changed the definition of marriage to allow for samesex marriage and would have allowed for ordination of open, practicing homosexuals as pastors, was voted against. The final vote was 449 (55%) 'no' to 374 (45%) 'yes.'

The Traditional Plan, which would maintain the current language of the Book of Discipline and strengthen accountability measures for bishops and pastors who choose to disobey church law, passed by a close margin. The final vote was 438 (53%) 'yes' to 384 (47%) 'no.'

What does this mean? It means that the United Methodist Book of Discipline will continue to say that while we love and value all people, the "practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore, self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in the United Methodist Church" (¶ 304.3 Book of Discipline 2016). Likewise, pastors are still not permitted to preside over same-sex ceremonies (¶ 341.6).




Spring Break Trip

So, for us here in Yazoo City, it means that nothing really changes. We still hold to what the Bible teaches as true, and we still love all people and want to share with everyone the life-changing truth of God's amazing grace through the Cross of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

One of the big takeaways from General Conference 2019 is that we are quickly becoming a global church. Over 30% of the delegates were from African conferences, places like East Congo and North Katanga. And you could see their influence from their speeches and their votes at this conference. They were strong advocates for the Traditional Plan that passed.

What's more, this influence will only grow as we move toward our next regularly-scheduled General Conference in May 2020. That Conference will have 862 delegates worldwide. The U.S. will have 22 fewer delegates in 2020, while Africa will gain 18 more and the Philippines will gain 2 more. Those two regions of the UMC will account for over 38% of voting delegates.

There are changes coming for the United Methodist Church, but it's not likely to be our doctrine on marriage and human sexuality. It's more likely to be our transition to a truly global church that focuses less on the U.S. and more on Africa and the Philippines.
