In other areas the flooding has lasted longer than it did back in 1927. Communities like Holly Bluff, Wolf Lake, Satartia, and Eagle Lake have been underwater since March, and the river has not yet fully crested. Many homes are currently underwater, others are protected by small levees and sandbags. Farmland that would normally be planted with corn or cotton is still submerged. In many places no crops will be planted this year. It is truly heartbreaking. We are reminded yet again as a community: what affects one of us, affects all of us.

So, please be in prayer. If you hear of someone in need, volunteer to help, and spread the word so that others may help, too. As the waters recede in the coming weeks, there will be a lot to do. It's in moments like these that we rely most on friends and community. By God's grace, let's be that community.


